Pamela Martin **CTV News at Six Anchor**

Vancouver, British Columbia—In October, 2001 Pamela Martin joined the BC affiliate of CTV as anchor of CTV News at Six, channel 9.

Martin began her career in broadcast in 1975, co-hosting and producing “Daybreak” on Victoria’s CHEK-TV. She joined CKNW in 1976 as their first female beat reporter and a year later moved to BCTV as their first female news anchor of a major 6 p.m. newscast. Pamela remained with BCTV until her move to CTV British Columbia in 2001.

She has been the honorary chair of the Canadian Cancer Society campaign for B.C. and the Yukon since 1998 and has actively worked to raise money and awareness for charities, including the Ladies Media Golf Classic, the United Way, the Canadian Breast Cancer Foundation to name a few.

Martin has participated in various other fundraising efforts for the Variety Club and Big Sisters of B.C., and in 2000 she became a founding member of ‘Circle of Friends’ which supports the Coast Foundation in their role of assisting people with mental illness. She has also served on the board of Directors for the Vancouver International Film Festival for more than eight years.

Pamela was born and raised in Detroit, Michigan. In 1968, as Miss Teen U.S.A., she toured the U.S. and Japan. She attended university in both Mexico and Italy and became fluent in the native languages of both countries before graduating from the University of Michigan with a major in Art History and Foreign Languages. She recently became a proud Canadian citizen in 2002.
